

The Florida Bar's Small Claims Rules Committee (Committee) has submitted to the Florida Supreme Court its regular-cycle report proposing new form 7.347 (Satisfaction of Judgment).

The Court invites all interested persons to comment on the Committee's proposed amendments, which are reproduced in full below, as well as online at <http://www.floridasupremecourt.org/decisions/proposed.shtml>. An original and nine paper copies of all comments must be filed with the Court on or before April 2, 2007, with a certificate of service verifying that a copy has been served on the Committee Chair, The Honorable Pauline M. Drayton, Duval County Courthouse, 330 E. Bay Street, Jacksonville, Florida 32202-2921, as well as a separate request for oral argument if the person filing the comment wishes to participate in oral argument, which may be scheduled for June 2007. The committee chair has until April 16, 2007, to file a response to any comments filed with the Court. Electronic copies of all comments also must be filed in accordance with the Court's administrative order In re Mandatory Submission of Electronic Copies of Documents, Fla. Admin. Order No. AOSC04-84 (Sept. 13, 2004).
