

The petition to invoke all writs jurisdiction is dismissed for lack of jurisdiction. See Williams v. State, 913 So. 2d 541, 543-44 (Fla. 2005) (stating that "[i]n the present cases . . . neither [petitioner] . . . cites an independent basis that would allow the Court to exercise its all writs authority, and no such basis is apparent on the face of the petitions"); St. Paul Title Ins. Corp. v. Davis, 392 So. 2d 1304, 1305 (Fla. 1980) (holding that article V, section 3(b)(7), Florida Constitution does not give this Court expanded appellate jurisdiction, and a petitioner may not seek all writs power as an independent basis of jurisdiction).
