IN RE: FLORIDA COURTS TECHNOLOGY COMMISSION

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

The purpose of the Florida Courts Technology Commission is to oversee, manage, and direct the development and use of technology within the judicial branch under the direction of the Florida Supreme Court, as specified in Florida Rule of Judicial Administration 2.236.

When the Commission was re-established in 2010, a system of staggered terms was instituted to avoid majority turnover in any year. Some members' terms expired on June 30, 2014. 

Public Member, Tallahassee


The Honorable Lisa Taylor Munyon shall continue to serve as Chair through June 30, 2016.
